HILL OF FARE WINDFARM PROPOSAL KNOW THE ISSUES

WHAT IS HAPPENING?


- RES and Dunecht estate proposing 16 turbines 180-200m tall. Will nearly double the height of the hill and be visible for miles from over 20 Community Council areas. In planning for 3 years.
- Battery storage area and substation, export route
- To create it will need access roads, cranes, blasting, peat removal and an export route (planning application comes after)
- 50 years plus lifetime NPF4 promotes repowering/renewal in perpetuity!

IS IT NEEDED – THE ENVIRONMENTAL CHALLENGE?

- We need renewable energy
- Scotland's onshore generation targets for 2030 are already on track by projects being built or approved.
- Onshore project congestion, network capability, constraint payments.
- Offshore comparable costs and more efficient, brownfield onshore?
- National Planning Framework 4 anywhere except National Parks and Special Landscape Areas (SLA) but only if impacts are mitigated.
- River Dee and valley is an SLA and the boundary is Raemoir road approach to the Cairngorms NP.

Dee Valley Special Landscape Area

- Aberdeenshire Council:
 - Dee Valley "is nationally important gateway to Cairngorm National Park and part of the setting of the National Park".
 - "The Dee is one of
 Aberdeenshire's major rivers,
 and the Dee Valley has a strong
 sense of place. It comprises an
 intact farmed valley landscape,
 with wooded sides rising to
 moorland hills. The Mounth
 rises to the south and the
 Grampian Outliers to the north".



ISSUES

- Loss of local democracy we have no say. Aberdeenshire Council and Community Councils are consultees **not** decision makers
- Visual impact too large for the surrounding populated landscape






Mid Hill + Fetteresso: Proximity to Homes & Businesses


- Each home / business is circled.
- Mid Hill has 6 homes / businesses within 3 km.
- Mid Hill + Fetteresso has 20 homes / businesses within 3 km.
- Turbines behind hills / ridges & most within a forest reducing visual impacts.

- ₱Fetteresso 150m turbine six
- #Fetteresso 180 or 200m turbine four



Hill of Fare: Proximity to Homes & Businesses

- Each home / business is circled.
- Hill of Fare would have ~103 homes / businesses within 3 km.
- Hill of Fare is heavily populated for a windfarm of this scale.
- Hill of Fare on crest of ridge – most wind farms are within forests and / or partly hidden behind ridges.





ISSUES (CTD)

• Wind Farm spread – if successful, opens the door to more in the area


South Lanarkshire / Dumries & Galloway Wind Farm Corridor

- Windfarms in the South Lanarkshire / Dumfries & Galloway wind farm corridor.
- Area is already heavily developed with 5 more projects awaiting construction.
- It has effectively been writtenoff as a rural landscape.
- Once turbines are established further ones are not considered 'incongruous' as landscape already characterized by windfarms.


ISSUES (CTD)

- Why turn Scotland into an industrial wasteland?


COMMUNITY COUNCIL SURVEY: ISSUES OF CONCERN TO How do you feel about the RESIDENTS





PLANNING PROCESS NEXT STEPS

2nd RES Community consultations:

- 20/21 June: Banchory Town Hall; Midmar Hall; Learney Hall Torphins; Echt Hall
- RES will revise proposal and submit full planning application 'late summer'
- ECU sends out to statutory consultees, 4 week response time but ASC get 4 months
- If consultees raise issues or request further information, RES must respond
- Crucially, if Aberdeenshire Council objects, it automatically triggers a Public Inquiry. ScotGov would appoint a planning judge 'Reporter' to review all issues/objections raised. Time for Inquiry fluid depending on issues raised and how quickly addressed.
- It is important that our local councillors are aware of our concerns
- The only way to appeal the Reporter's decision is through a Judical Review
